On August 6, 1945, Shigeko Sasamori survived the atomic bombing of Hiroshima. Please join us in this rare opportunity to meet and discuss with Shigeko Sasamori and hear her story of hope and courage.

In 1955, Norman Cousins, American journalist and peace activist, brought a group of 25 victims of the atomic bomb attack to America for reconstructive surgery. These girls were referred to as the Hiroshima Maidens. Shigeko Sasamori was one of them. Sasamori continued her education in America and became a nurse. She has dedicated her life to promoting peace throughout the world and spreading the message of Hiroshima.
